These questions for younger children are designed to accompany the story "Shubert and Sophie Stay Home."

In the free printable story "<u>Shubert and Sophie Stay Home</u>," your favorite lightning bug siblings learn to navigate their big feelings about COVID-19 with help from their parents. The story highlights useful strategies like deep breathing and practicing gratitude.

After reading the story, younger children can answer these questions to reflect on family fun, helpful solutions to grumpy actions, and creating a family gratitude ritual. Read the questions with your children, then have children illustrate their answers in the provided boxes.

Like other Shubert stories and extensions, this activity promotes literacy, character building, and the development of helpful lifelong skills.


What are some of the fun things you have done as a family?
